



Rider to Residential Agreement with Assisted-Living Facility

Resident relies on Facility's representation that Facility will be the resident's "home," with the dignity and privacy that implies. Resident hopes to remain in this home for the duration of his/her life.

As the end of life approaches, a variety of options for dying at home are accepted in law and medicine in every state in the United States. Resident may consider many end-of-life options and may choose among the following:

- Hospice or palliative care services in the home
- Foregoing or directing the withdrawal of life prolonging treatments,
- Aggressive pain and/or symptom management, including palliative sedation,
- Voluntary refusal of food and fluids.

Facility will respect Resident's end-of-life choices and will not impede any course of treatment, or non-treatment, freely and rationally chosen by Resident and accepted in law and medicine in the state in which Facility is located.
